WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY STATEMENT

Esh Construction Ltd recognises the scope of our activities, including civil engineering, domestic and non-domestic new build, refurbishment and maintenance has the potential to produce significant amounts of waste. We also understand that when waste is managed correctly it can be a valuable resource, helping our transition towards a circular economy.

Esh Construction's commitments to waste management include:

- Disposal of all waste in line with the waste hierarchy (reduce, re-use, recycle);
- Fulfilling our Duty of Care obligations by appointing licensed waste contractors who dispose of waste at licensed facilities, and ensuring all waste transfer notes/ hazardous waste consignment notes are correctly completed;
- BRE Smart Waste online SWMP or Esh Construction site waste management plan (form EPF022) to be completed and kept up to date on all construction sites with a project value greater than £300k;
- Site teams to be made aware of the waste disposal requirements through daily briefings and toolbox talks;
- Construction site waste to be segregated between hazardous and non-hazardous as a minimum, with separate waste streams i.e. timber, metals, where space allows;
- Skips to be adequately signposted to avoid contamination;
- Office waste to be segregated at source, with a minimum of paper/card and general waste;
- Exploring opportunities for reducing waste, including ordering materials pre-cut to size, arranging for suppliers to take back packaging, value engineering and pre-refurbishment waste audits;
- Measuring waste management performance, setting new targets and continuously improving.

We actively encourage all our employees and supply chain partners to understand their individual responsibilities and recognise that our short and long term development goals should be achieved through a responsible approach to social, environmental and ethical issues.

The company will embrace the principles of sustainability as it goes about its day to day business.
